- 3. ATTENTION ALL SUPERVISORS: Recently a dependent youth on summer overhire employment was involved in a special purpose vehicle accident. The young man was not experienced in appropriate the reliable purpose vehicle accident. ienced in operating the vehicle, was not licensed to drive it, and was not authorized or told to do so. These young people are eager, energetic and in most cases inexperienced. - 4. CLOSING OF SPANGDAHLEM TRASH DUMP: The trash dump in the village of Spangdahlem is closed, effective Monday 3 Jul 67. No more trash may be dumped at this location as the area has been filled up and covered over with new soil. This restriction applies equally to AF personnel residing in the area of Dudeldorf, Gindorf and Pickliessen who have previously disposed of trash in this area. Plans are being made to open a new dump site within the next few days. (OI/6012)

- 7. ADMINISTRATIVE DISCHARGE: AB George W Bell, AF11784763, 49th Fld Maint Sq is returning to the CONUS for Administrative Discharge under provisions of AFM 39-12. All interested base agencies are requested to clear outstanding accounts immediately. (BPMIOP/6896)
- 8. RELOCATION OF 73RD ASW: The 73RD Aerospace Surveilance Wing will be relocated at Tyndall AFB, Florida, effective 14 Jul 67. All letter correspondence generated on or after 9 Jul 67 must be addressed 73rd Aerospace Surveillance Wing Tyndall AFB, Florida 32401. All message traffic must be addressed to both locations: 73DSW Ent AFB Colo and 73rd ASW Tyndall AFB Florida, until 14 Jul 67. All message traffic after 14 Jul transmitted to the Tyndall address only. (CAS/6208)
  - 9. OWNER UNIT RESPONSIBILITY: Throughout the normal duty day for organizations that possess priority "B" resources, personnel or those organizations will maintain alertness within restricted areas to detect anything that strikes or is cast toward and anyone who approaches these resources, and anyone who approaches or attempts to penetrate the restricted area boundary. Personnel who work in or around priority "B" resources during normal duty hours are responsible for the security protection of these resources. (SP/6080)
  - 10. ATTENTION PERSONNEL: Attention is directed to personnel subsisting in Field Ration Dining Halls #1 and #2. Effective 1 Jul 67, Department of Defense Directive established uniform policies and procedures governing the food allowance for enlisted members of the military service. This directive provides an increase in the food allowance but limitations on milk. The excess milk program was terminated 30 Jun 67, and the amount of milk authorized per man, per day, is 32 fluid onces (one quart). (SVSFS/6266)
  - 11. UNREGISTERED/UNLICENSED VEHICLES: POV owners/operators are cautioned that USAFER 125-8, Registration of POV in Germany, prohibits the operation or parking of a POV, or permitting it to be parked or operated, on any public highway, public area, dependent housing area, or military installation in the FRG or Berlin unless the POV is properly registered. It is also a violation of WSAFER 125-8 to park a POV on any public highway, or public area, dependent housing area, or any area that may be viewed by the public, unless valid USAREUR license plates are properly affixed to the front and rear of the vehicle. You may park a POV without license plates (if you possess a valid nonoperational registration) in a public garage or storage warehouse, on a US military installation (excluding housing areas) if the installation commander grants written permission. You may park such a vehicle on property owned or rented by you if the vehilce is screened from public view. (SP/6080)
